The exhibition “The multiplication of the loaves: Feeding the community” showcases the ingenuity and resourcefulness of the Sisters of Saint Anne in feeding their religious community and its dependents.



The photos, documents and artifacts selected to illustrate the horticultural and culinary exploits of the Sisters of Saint Anne are presented in a colourful and dynamic museography that will introduce you to the culinary heritage of the Sisters of Saint Anne.

The exhibition will be open to the public free of charge from May 17, 2013 to March 31, 2014.

Located in a heritage building dating from the 19th century, the Sisters of Saint Anne Historic Centre also gives visitors an opportunity to experience a genuine convent atmosphere. The permanent exhibitions trace the development of the Congregation from its origins in 1850 to the present day.
