Temporary Exhibition Extension – Vocation: Teaching

Montreal, Lachine Borough, April 18, 2012- The 26th Montreal Museums Day is an opportunity to open wide the doors of the Sisters of Saint Anne Historic Centre. This year, to meet public demand, the Historic Centre has chosen to extend its temporary exhibition *Vocation: Teaching*.



Vocation: Teaching pictures the dedicated Sisters who, over the course of 150 years, taught in 14 schools in Lachine. This exhibition provides a look at Lachine's educational heritage from different perspectives: that of the teachers, but also that of the students. It features personal accounts, photos, books, documents, artifacts and teaching materials once used by the Sisters and their pupils. Vocation: Teaching is an invitation to meet a group of women who devoted their lives to education.

This project has received financial support from the Ministère de la Culture et des Communications du

Québec and Ville de Montréal as part of the Entente sur le développement culturel de Montréal 2008-2011.

The Sisters of Sainte Anne Historical Center is located in an exceptional setting, on the shores of Canal Lachine and inside of an historic building from the 19th century which had housed the Sisters of Sainte-Anne since 1861. Its various exhibitions are an opportunity to discover the history of the Sisters of Sainte-Anne through the places they have lived and worked in and the people they have worked with.
